*Receiver Barsz started off this meeting with an introduction of himself.*

The Receiver's meeting opened with a call to order by Receiver, Mr. Peter Barsz and the Pledge of Allegiance.

**REPORT FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT**

**Gregory Shannon** – I am pleased to announce that we have completed the 2015-2016 school year. We had a wonderful graduation ceremony last Friday. We graduated 238 children from our high schools and it was a real point-of-pride. In addition, we graduated 31 students from our Camelot Accelerated Program and of those 31, 94% are going on to post-secondary education. Again, that is a real point-of-pride for us. We are ramping up for our MARS summer program. Our MARS program will be in the CUSA building, K through 6 grades and in our STEM building for grades 7 and 8 and, in addition, we have a great partnership with the Chester Education Fund for Credit Recovery for grades 9 through 12 in the STEM building. In addition, we have a full ESY program that will be in the STEM building and finally, we will be beginning our school opening dashboard process mid-July and setting up for the 2016-2017 school year. That concludes my report, Mr. Barsz.

*Receiver Peter Barsz introduced some new faces on the panel – Dr. Christopher McGinley, newly appointed Chief Recovery Officer, appointed by the Department of Education, my two attorneys, George Dawson and Robert DiOrio.*

**STUDENT RECOGNITION & PRESENTATIONS**

Mr. Shannon wanted to recognize our wonderful, fabulous and beautiful children from CUSA, the Ballroom Troupe that performed at the last meeting. They won first place in the Ballroom Competition for Team, Dancing Classrooms, Philly, Southeastern PA. The children were given an award certificate and medal.

**COMMENDATIONS**

A commendation was given to Darla Hammond, previous Principal of Chester High School.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING OF MAY 18, 2016**

Previous Receiver Barnes approved.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS**

**Dennis Martinelli** – Congratulated George Dawson on his appointment as one of the District’s lawyers.

Congratulated Claudia Averette on her retirement and wanted to let her know that she will be truly missed.

Said that Graduation was a disgrace for the STEM students, since they got a diploma from Chester High School instead and he thought they worked hard to be STEM students and should be recognized as such on their diplomas. He believes that we are not selling STEM properly as an alternative to Chester High where students can get more college and career readiness courses. He believes that the students graduating 8th grade from the Charters and even our own Toby Farms 8<sup>th</sup> grade graduates will opt to go to the new Charter High School being built because of its newness and their giveaways. They are not going to understand what STEM means to the community and saving the district. He thinks we won’t be able to sell it to them, if we can’t even recognize it ourselves.

**Farela Howie** – She is a retiree since 2014 and retired along with some others that received a small health package and for the past year, haven't received any type of reimbursement and wanted to know if it has been resolved.

**Mr. Barsz** – answered that he would be happy to take that up with HR.

**Calvin Church** – Troubled by the vandalism and lack of up-keep on Columbus School and asked if there was any prospects of having it secured and cleaned-up.

**Mr. Barsz** - We have secured a contract to get the school secured and the grass and other maintenance is being taken care of this week.

**Mr. Church** – Wanted to know why the Superintendent didn't take any pictures with the children from CUSA that got the awards.

**Cephus Richardson** – Asked about Personnel agenda items. He wanted to know if the positions were listed on the CUSD website. He also wanted to know if the positions for resignations were listed. He also asked about community members applying for the open positions and were they being given a chance to interview and are they being placed as the top of the list. He also asked how these positions are being posted besides our website.

**Alvina Jenkins** – answered that the positions that were listed in new hires were posted. She also explained that for the resignations on this agenda, we wait for the hiring manager to let us know if it will be back-filled. Ms. Jenkins said that everyone that applies is given an interview and that, no, we do not “raise any one to the top” for any reason. They are given a chance like anyone else who applies and are vetted like anyone else. There is a rubric that is used during interviews and she tries to keep the same interview team for all interviews for that position so it is fair. The Board members have been invited to sit in on the interviews, especially for the Leadership positions being posted. Ms. Jenkins said that because of money constraints, we do not post to the papers or other places that have fees; we look at social and other media sites that are free and we also post at colleges and universities.

*Someone also spoke up, but did not identify himself, and said that we should also utilize the local churches to post our open positions.*

**Anthony Johnson** – He asked about the length of time served for the retirees listed. He thought that we should have done a little something to acknowledge them.

He wanted everyone to know that it was the first time he sat on the panel at a Meeting in four years. He said that the elected Board has been trying for 5 years to get Columbus secured and cleaned up. He said that he had been getting the same complaints for 4 years from the City and they were holding off citing it because of the relationship they have with the elected board, but that relationship was coming to an end because of the condition of that building. They had a realtor come in and he said we can't even sell it. But it is finally being taken care of. He realizes that it is not Mr. Barsz's, the new Receiver, fault as he has only been here a few weeks and has a lot of catching up to do, but not with what PDE is telling him, but accurate information from the School District and the Board. He wanted to let everyone know that he will be on watch regarding PDE, because he believes that they are the cause of all of our financial problems because they want to keep control over this district. They haven't done anything to help us. He cited the case against the charter schools to lower the Special Education tuition paid to them from \$40,000 down to \$27,000 per student. That didn't come from

PDE, it came from the local school board. They have been fighting to keep this district going and they still have to fight. His duty as an elected official is to let the people know when someone is trying to get away with something as PDE does and he will not be silenced.

*Receiver Barsz asked if there was anyone else that wanted to speak. Several people raised their hands:*

**Sue Campbell** - Thought that it should either be Chester High or STEM, but should be unified. Upset because her niece was one of several valedictorians for Chester High and STEM, but she felt was being disrespected, because the other valedictorian's parent was upset about it. Also wanted to know why there were no AP courses offered at Chester High, since her niece was a straight A student, but because she came from Cyber, she couldn't get into STEM and wanted higher courses.

**Gregory Shannon** – answered that the reason for the Chester High diploma was that so many parents said that they graduated Chester High and their parents before them graduated from Chester High so they wanted their child, even though they want to STEM, to have a Chester High diploma, but then some parents wanted the diploma to be from STEM, so they are working that out. He said that the reason for dual valedictorians was so that each school, Chester High and STEM, would be celebrated equally and the reason why there were three this year because the grade point average of the two Chester High students were too close to call and the students agreed to share. With reference to the AP courses at Chester High, he said that we are building an AP program as we go forward. He also told her that we do have dual enrollment with Widener University as well as Delaware County Community College.

**Ms. Campbell/her niece** – Said that she (niece) applied for the dual enrollment and was denied. She was told that they were not doing it this year, but that she had done it the year before.

*Receiver Barsz suggested that Superintendent Shannon and she continue this at a later date and for the superintendent to make sure he looked into this.*

*Jean Arnold asked if she could add a comment to this and the Receiver agreed.*

**Jean Arnold** – suggested that they get a group of people together regarding the graduation this year, because there were issues that the Receiver may not understand or know about.

**Peter Barsz** – agreed and said that he wanted everyone to know that his door is always open and that his assistant, Chris, would always be happy to set up a meeting. He said that he would look into the graduation.

**John Shelton** – welcomed the new Receiver and told him, as he told the others sitting on the panel, that what he does makes a difference in whether this city survives as well as this district. He said that the job is getting the children educated because education is the one thing that no one can take away from you. He wished the Receiver good luck.

**Martha Newman** – teacher for 42 years, but retired. She wanted to know if we have a PR person, because we have some very positive things going on that need to be reported. Thinks that we should have an oversight committee for the Charter Schools to see what is going on there. She said that they are not teaching our children; she tutors some of the children from the Charters and they are not up-to-grade.
